Macquarie Ice Skating Club Guidelines

The principal activities of the club are:

- Promotion of Interest and the Participation in the sport of Figure Skating
- Supporting MISC members who are active within the sport of Figure Skating
- Training and Development of MISC members and their coaches
- Organisation of Club hosted Figure Skating competitions and NSW Test sessions
- Hosting social opportunities for MISC members, their families and friends

The club operates as an Incorporated Association under the Associations Act (NSW) 2009 and as such is not permitted to trade or secure monetary gain for its members.

The Macquarie Ice Skating Club Council is responsible for the administration and management of the club. This is achieved by conducting monthly, formalised meetings and informal discussions outside of the monthly meetings.

All Office Bearer positions are decided by nomination at the Club's Annual General Meeting. Committee positions are also voted on at the AGM. If a position is vacant throughout the year and interest is shown, this position may be filled by vote at a monthly meeting or if necessary at a "special meeting" called by the Executive.

No members of the Council receive financial reward for acting in their capacity. Council Members are entitled for reimbursement of the NSW ISA membership fee as this membership is mandatory for all council members if the Club seeks to be represented at NSW ISA Council meetings.

All Club members were insured during 2019 for personal injury and the Club for Public Liability and Professional Indemnity under the National Insurance Scheme instituted by Ice Skating Australia.

The Club Constitution empowers the Council to prescribe By-Laws that are reviewed and ratified each year.

The 2019 Council encourage parents, guardians, and skaters over the age of 18 to become involved in the MISC Committee. It is the strength of the volunteers and members that creates the successes the Club enjoys.

2019 was successful for the club. This year we saw the 26th anniversary of MIRA, which was a resounding success with many members competing. The club championships were also very well attended. The club purchased a trophy cabinet in which to display the club's trophies. The trophy cabinet is located in the cafe at the rink.

Treasurer's Report

The club is in a strong financial position with total assets of \$138,300.18.

We currently have \$49,090.95 in the MISC operating account, \$15,833.11 in at-call savings, and \$73,376.12 in term deposits.

For the year of 2019, the club had a gross profit of \$21,527.93, with an operating profit of \$6,914.87.

Our major source of income for the year came from competitions (\$15,828.31) followed by Club membership dues (\$4,724.62).

Our major expenditures were the purchase of the new trophy cabinet (\$2,011.90), NSWISA fees and charges (\$3,089.87) and trophies and medals (\$1,710.74).

In 2019, Dominoes Synchronised Ice Skating Team represented Macquarie Ice Skating Club at Synchrofest Skating Competition at Macquarie Ice Skating Rink, NSW State Championships at Canterbury Ice Rink and Australian Figure Skating Championships in Melbourne in the Adult Synchronised Ice Skating Division. Our routine was performed to a Beatles medley, and our black and silver costumes had plenty of bling.

Dominoes placed 1st in Synchrofest, 2nd at NSW Championships and 5th at the Australian National Figure Skating Championships, ahead of the other two NSW teams.

Throughout 2019, Dominoes trained on Sunday nights with our coach Georgie Reilly. Georgie is tremendously skilled, supportive and enthusiastic, and every year she brings fantastic choreography ideas which we do our very best to perform. At different points during the year, we also benefited by input from Paul Huehnergard and Blaise Pearce.

Along with so many other invested parties, Dominoes team members contributed to the Save Macquarie Ice Rink campaign in early 2019, which was thankfully successful.

Shortly before Nationals 2019, Dominoes joined Majestic Ice Australia Synchronised Ice Skating Group, and from 2020 we will be known as Majestic Dominoes. Team members have already benefited by attending Majestic skating skills sessions during December 2019 and January 2020.

As always a highlight of being a member of Dominoes is the team camaraderie and support while we are skating - doing something we love, with the added bonus of getting exercise, maintaining our health and fitness, and improving our skills.
